



- 1. Doctorate or comparable academic degree (Ph.D., C.Sc. or equivalent), completed less than four years prior to the date of application. Candidates who have nearly completed their doctoral degrees are eligible to apply provided that they submit the manuscript of their dissertation or publications containing the results of their dissertation.
- Academic publications reviewed according to international standards and printed in journals and/or by publishing houses.
- 3. Confirmation that research facilities are available and mentoring agreement and a detailed expert's report by an academic host at a research institution in Germany. Details of the research project and the proposed timetable must be discussed with the prospective host prior to application.
- Expert reviews from the doctoral supervisor and two other academics qualified to give well-founded comments on the applicant's eligibility, preferably including reviewers not working at the applicant's own institute.
- Language skills: scholars in the humanities or social sciences and physicians must have a good knowledge of German if it is necessary to carry out the project successfully; otherwise a good knowledge of English; scientists and engineers must have a good knowledge of German or English.







information on factors that led to rejection to applicant and host approx. 5 weeks after selection meeting re-application possible, but only after further scientific development and while taking into account the factors for rejection


1. Vinci programme (deadline: March every year)

- Contribution to mobility of PhD students under co-supervision (covers travel Italy-France & accommodation expenses in France) 4000 Euro lumped sum
- PhD scholarships under co-supervision
- 1 year post-doc scholarship for doctors who had a previous co-supervision (6 months to be spent in France)

2. Galileo programme (deadline: March every year)

1-year grant to support joint research between Italian and French teams on:

- (a) Health
- (b) Energy production; safety in energy production and transport
- (c) Knowledge, maintenance and valorization of cultural heritage (application of new technologies to cultural heritage).

It covers accommodation and travel expenses of the teams (up to 3000 Euro)

International Exchanges Scheme

This scheme is for scientists in the UK who want to stimulate new collaborations with leading scientists overseas through either a one-off visit or bilateral travel.

Both the UK applicant and overseas applicant must:

- have a PhD, or be likely to have a PhD by the time the funding starts
- hold a fixed or permanent contract at an eligible organisation for the duration of the project (ineligible organisations include industrial, private and commercial organisations, university spin-out companies, government bodies and research institutes and research councils)
- be based in the respective countries at the time of the application



Italy-UK bilateral projects

Value and tenure

The funding available is dependent upon the length of the visit. Applicants may request:

- up to of £3,000 for one-off travel lasting up to 3 months
- up to £6000 for multiple visits to be completed within 1 year (including a maximum of £1000 for research expenses)
- up to £12,000 for multiple visits to be completed within 2 years and cost share projects fixed at 2 years (including a maximum of £2000 for research expenses)

Marie Curie Actions: IOF grants

For <u>researchers from EU & Associated Countries with a doctoral degree</u> or at least 4 years' full-time equivalent research experience.

- Salary for the researcher and a contribution to research-related costs
- Financial support for up to 3 years in all (initial outgoing phase of 1-2 years & 1 year mandatory reintegration phase)
- Host organisation: university, research centre or enterprise established and located in a Third Country (for the outgoing phase) and in an EU or Associated Country (for the return phase)

Research project to be prepared in coordination with the organisation that will host you when you return to Europe. You should also agree on a personal career development plan with your supervisor in the return host organisation.

Strengthen your multi- or interdisciplinary expertise, inter-sectoral experience and complementary skills.

Marie Curie Actions: IIF grants

For researchers from EU & Associated Countries with a doctoral degree or at least 4 years' full-time equivalent research experience.

IIF funding is provided for a research project which will **transfer knowledge** into your host organisation and building or enhancing **collaborations** between Europe and the rest of the world.

The research project will also allow you to **advance your career**. Financial support is provided for **12-24 months** (full-time equivalent).

Funding allows you to:

- join a **EU research team** that doesn't have your experience
- establish a **collaboration** through a research project
- gain **new knowledge** in a European lab.

Your **IIF** may also cover a **return phase** of one year.
